dropped in on the villa at Villefrance because Ms Houteman had telephoned him as he was driving into Nice with a friend He had visited her that afternoon because, after meeting briefly at a Belgian motor race, "she had made me her race, "she had made me her confident and wanted to talk about the problems she vas having with her boyfriend . . . ! thought I could give her some advice and information about Nice," he said.

"She gave me two glasses of vin rose and it was from that point that everything went

weird," he told the court.
